The Rutland Area Lamb and Wool Producers (RALWP), with support from the American Lamb Board, will hold the 21st Annual Pittsford Sheep Festival on Sunday, October 12, 2014 at the Pittsford Recreation Area on Furnace Road in Pittsford. Library Happenings



With almost 150 children participating in our reading program, “*FIZZ, BOOM, BANG!*” has been the most successful summer program ever. Many reasons account for this, Rolf and Ursula Hirschmann of H Hirschmann LTD sponsoring this summer’s activities, Kamuda’s Country Market, Keith’s Country Store, and Conway’s Mobil, awarding over 350 popsicles, and the Recreation Department donating two Family Passes for our summer reading raffle.

Though, a large part of this success is due to our *It’s a Crime Not to Read Program*. Begun in 2010, it is a collaboration between Lothrop Elementary, Vermont State Police, and your community library. The program is very generously funded by OMYA. Each month we visit the first, second and third grade classes and read a book the students keep, bring home and share with their families. The first third grade class to participate are now students entering 6th grade!

Over 70% of this year’s *It’s a Crime Not to Read* students participated in the summer reading program. While most communities average around 50%, overall 65% of Lothrop students participated in our program – up from 45% in 2010. That, my friends, is something for our community to be proud of.

LOTHROP SCHOOL NEWS

Pittsford School Board

On the first day of school all Lothrop students were greeted by every adult staff member wearing a blue Pawstive Pittsford Panther T-shirt. The school successfully rolled out the new MTSSB (Multi Tiered Student Support Behavior). The entire staff received a half-day training in MTSSB during in-service. The PBis part of the new system was explained to students. Students earn paws for following the three school rules; Be Safe, Be Responsible and Be Respectful. For each 5 paws they earn, they get to put a paper paw up in the school lobby. Our lobby windows are getting full! There is a new tab on Lothrop's website titled MTSSB. This page has a family PowerPoint to explain our new system. A Family Brochure was also sent home on the first day of school to all families.

Our Principal, Sara Raabe, has been working very hard to create STEM (Science Technology Engineering and Math) opportunities for our students by writing grants. Thanks to generous donations from Rutland Walmart who gave us \$250, the Department of Corrections who gave us \$200, the PTO who put a line item into their budget of \$3,000 and OMYA gave us the full grant amount of \$6,710, we will be able to create a Makerspace. This includes a 3D Printer, Lego Robotics, a Green Screen and Adobe Pro for movie making, Squishy Circuits, Conductive Thread and Arduino Boards. Weekly exploratory STEM based activities will begin for grades 4, 5 and 6 in October. These items will be available for all grade levels to access. Classroom teachers, Unified Arts teachers and hopefully community members will be running additional Exploratory Groups one hour per week during six week blocks. If you are interested in helping, please contact Sara Raabe at 483-2242.

As many of you are aware, Lothrop School is 102 years old. The building has been beautifully maintained and preserved. When the school was built, it was not the custom to insulate the walls or the huge attic. Lothrop's heating system is very old as are the pipes. The boiler as well as the fuel oil tank are near the end of their lives. Last year we spent \$68,000 on fuel oil. As members of the School Board and entrusted representatives of the taxpayers, we felt that this amount was outrageous. We authorized an energy audit and as a result we have developed an Energy Efficiency Plan with the help of N B F Architects, who brought in an engineer. Both the architect and the engineer proposed that with the completion of this plan we could lower our heating bill by \$40,000. The plan includes attic insulation in both the school and the Lothrop School Gym, inside insulation of the 1911 school building's foundation and outside insulation of the Town Hall's foundation, a Wood Pellet System, a Heat Recovery System and a Direct Digital Control System. If all members of the Lothrop School Board and all members of the Pittsford Select Board agree to this plan, then we will be able to use the Burditt Fund to finance this project. That means that it will not cost the taxpayers of Pittsford anything. We believe that this plan represents necessary steps needed to insure that Lothrop School will continue to provide another hundred years of education in a more cost efficient way. If the plan is unanimously agreed to, please watch for articles in the Brandon Pittsford Reporter on this proposal during October and an informational brochure will be sent to every Pittsford and Florence resident in mid October. Then there will be an informational meeting at the Lothrop School Gym on Monday evening, November 3rd at 7 p.m. and a Bond Vote will take place on Election Day, November 4th at the Lothrop School Gym (which is the new Polling Place).

School is back in session. That means that school buses are once again rolling through Town in the mornings and afternoons during the school week. It is therefore important for motorists to remember to take extra care when driving near school buses. Extra cards available: 10-bag card/\$20.00 at the Town Office via cash or check or at the **Transfer Station by check only**. 5-bag punch card/\$10.00 cash only are available at Kamuda's Country Store or Keith's Country Store. **Residents must have new permit stickers by 11/1/14 in order to use the Pittsford Transfer Station.**
