September 12, 2016

Hello, from Bob Foley, Field Chief of the Pittsford First Response. I would like to start by thanking the Pittsford Select Board and the Town Manager for their help and support since I have been in the position of Field Chief. I also want to thank the citizens of Pittsford for the kind words and support of our local First Response squad. It is a pleasure and privilege to serve this community. We have been very fortunate in the last year to have our crew expand, allowing for better coverage during the day. A special thanks to Colleen Gilman, EMT-Paramedic Level, for teaching an Emergency Medical Responder Course this last Spring and Fall and to the Pittsford Fire Department for allowing us to use their facilities to run the course.

We have been able to cover events in town and participated in a fund-raising cook out at the Pittsford Recreation Area Open House. We are in the process of starting another fundraiser- -E911 signage; details to follow in a Town-wide mailing to all residents in Pittsford.

As the First Response grows, so do our needs. The most important need is in the area of communications. We are in need of new pagers and portables to keep up with changes in narrow banding as well as special channels for EMS and Mass Casualty Incidents (as our ambulance is on the list for MCI response for Rutland County). With perseverance, continued support and fundraising efforts, I believe it will happen. Please find below a list of National Registry EMS providers, on your Pittsford First Response, who are here to help when called on.

Pittsford Representative to the Rutland County Solid Waste District

There is big change taking place across Vermont regarding how garbage and recyclables are handled. Work with colleagues from other member towns to assure that our State gets even smarter and greener when it comes to the disposal of garbage and recyclable materials. Meetings are monthly in Rutland.

Pittsford Representative to BLSG Mosquito District Board

Pittsford has recently joined the Brandon-Leicester-Salisbury-Goshen Mosquito District, for purposes of sampling and treating with larvacide wetland locations in town. Each of the District’s member towns are entitled to two representatives on the Board which oversees the District’s activities and finances. One Member has already been appointed and another one is needed to fully protect Pittsford’s interests. Meetings usually take place in Brandon on the first Thursday of the month, with a wintertime break.

Zoning Board of Adjustment

Interested in land use issues? The Town’s ZBA has a vacancy. Meetings are relatively infrequent—generally a handful of meetings per year. Help your colleagues address zoning applications and resolve disputes.

PITTSFORD HISTORICAL SOCIETY



The Pittsford Historical Society will hold its annual membership meeting on Sunday Oct. 23rd at the Congregational Church with a potluck supper starting at 5:30 pm. This is the meeting at which elections for officers are held; any candidates interested in office should contact the Society. After the meeting, Steve Belcher will talk on Dr. Henry Haven Swift (1855-1926) and the Pittsford of his times.

We invite people in Pittsford to take note of the new historic marker commemorating Pittsford’s iron industry (1791-1882) on the Town Green. Pittsford holds the honor of having the longest iron making industry in Vermont in the 18th and 19th century. At its peak, Pittsford’s Granger foundry produced hundreds of cast iron stoves a year for kitchens, parlors, and bedrooms and the museum at Eaton Hall has five of them in its collections.

The Museum will remain open on Tuesdays (9 am-4 pm) until early November. Sunday hours (1-4 pm) end in early October. The museum will be closed during the winter months, but can be opened by appointment. The contact information is: PO Box 423 Pittsford VT 05763; www.pittsfordhistorical.com; 802-483-2040.
