Attention Pittsford Voters! FIRE DISTRICT MERGER INTO TOWN

As most of you already know, pursuant to a successful bond vote here in Town, the Town obtained grant and loan funds to finance construction to connect the Town's water system to the infrastructure of Fire District No. 1 (Orchard Hill), the Country Club and 8 residences tied into the Club's service line. The idea was to add customers to the Town Water System and to earn more each year from new customers than the cost of financing the project. This project has now been successfully completed and the Town began to supply water to these new customers on October 7.

Now, all that remains is the legal formality of a vote authorizing the Fire District to merge into the Town and end the Fire District's separate existence. Once there is such a vote here in Town, the Vermont Legislature will act on a bill to ratify the merger.

The following ballot question will appear on your ballot on Tuesday, March 4:

Shall Pittsford Fire District No. 1 merge into the Town of Pittsford pursuant to a plan of merger approved by the Select Board of the Town of Pittsford on January 15, 2014 and by the Prudential Board of Pittsford Fire District No. 1 on September 14, 2012?

We hope you will make a point to vote **YES** on this important ballot question.

LISTERS

VETERANS EXEMPTION Veterans who are residents of Pittsford, with a disability of 50% or more, are entitled to a \$40,000 exemption off assessed value of their property for tax purposes. Those veterans should receive a letter and form from the Office of Veterans Affairs which should be signed and returned. If a veteran is qualified but has not received a letter, we suggest a call to the VA office at 802-828-3379. Application forms are also available at the Town Offices or on the State website: state.vt.us.gov.

HOMESTEAD DECLARATION All homeowners whose legal residence is Pittsford are required to file the Homestead Exemption (HS-122). Tax Forms can be obtained at the Maclure Library or on-line at: state.vt.us.gov/tax. Late filing will be accepted through October 15 but a late filing penalty will apply after April 15th.

GRIEVANCE Property owners will receive a letter regarding the grievance procedure if their parcel has changed in value or ownership.

Any questions about the items above or any other matter regarding valuation of property in Pittsford will be promptly answered by calling the Listers' Office at 802-483-6500 ext 15.

DOG OWNERSHIP RULES

The Town learned during its recent "dog census" that many dog-owners weren't familiar with the laws regarding dog ownership in Town. For example, did you know that all dogs must be registered with the Town each year? Did you know that dog owners must provide evidence of rabies vaccinations for each dog, as well? Did you know that dog owners must keep their dogs on their own property or under physical or voice control at all times?

Some of these rules are simply good manners and designed to keep the peace in your neighborhood. Others are matters of public health and safety. All are spelled out in detail in the Town's Animal Ordinance, a copy of which is posted online at www.pittsfordvermont.com.

Zero-Sort Recycling

The Town has had its Zero-Sort recycling system in place at the Transfer Station for several months now and the feedback from residents has been very positive. People seem to appreciate the speed and efficiency of the new approach to recycling.

The only issue preventing the process from working even better is the larger cardboard items which come from time to time. Larger pieces of cardboard (larger than 2' x 2') have a way of "gumming up the works", so to speak, as the compactor operates. Therefore, we would appreciate it if residents flatten and cut up their larger pieces of cardboard into pieces (smaller than 2' x 2') before placing them into the chute at the recyclables compactor. This will help minimize clogs in the chute and resulting delays.

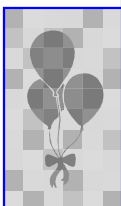

DOG LICENSES DUE APRIL 1, 2014

Please note that dog licenses are now available at the Pittsford Town Clerk's Office. All dogs must be registered by **April 1st**. In order to register your dog, you must give the Town Clerk a copy of the most recent rabies vaccination certificate. Your veterinarian always gives you two copies, one for your files and one for our files. If you are unsure whether your dog's rabies certificate is up to date, please call your veterinarian or us at (802) 483-6500 Ext. 11, 12, 13, or 24. The fees to register your dog(s) are as follows:



	Fee by April 1 st	Additional Fee After April 1 st
Female Spayed	\$8	\$2
Male Neutered	\$8	\$2
Female Not Spayed	\$12	\$4
Male Not Neutered	\$12	\$4

Any person who sells or exchanges or who offers to sell or exchange cats, dogs, or wolf-hybrids, or any combination thereof, from three or more litters of cats, dogs, or wolf-hybrids in any 12-month period will need a Pet Dealer License. The fee is \$25.00. Kennel permits are now obsolete. **DOG LICENSE REMINDER—DOG TAGS ARE IN.** DOGS ARE REQUIRED TO BE LICENSED EACH YEAR WITH THE TOWN BY **APRIL 1, 2014**. Don't wait until the last day. A rabies certificate is required. If you haven't already registered your dog, please stop by the Town Clerk's Office **BEFORE APRIL 1, 2014**. The next rabies clinic by the Town will be in 2015.
