NEW RECREATION DIRECTOR

As we noted in the last edition of the Newsletter, Randy Adams has retired from his post as Pittsford's Recreation Director. We miss his daily presence at the Town Offices and at the Recreation Area, although we bump into him from time to time around town. We continue to wish Randy and his family the very best as Randy moves forward with his life's next chapters.

Upon Randy's retirement, the Town established a Hiring Committee to evaluate candidates wishing to succeed Randy as Recreation Director. The Committee consisted of the Town Manager, three members of the Town's Recreation Committee and of course, Randy Adams. Brandon Recreation Director Bill Moore also played an important role as an advisor to the Committee. The Committee reviewed twelve strong applications, interviewed five candidates, corresponded further with several finalists and checked on references.

At the end of the process, it was the consensus of the Committee to hire Nelson Brown, 28, who earned his B.S. Degree in Recreation Management and has held several positions in the field of recreation. Nelson's Minor in Business Administration will also come in handy, as the Select Board has asked that he to give some attention to economic development within Pittsford, as his schedule allows. Nelson is excited to begin work and will report for duty on Monday, December 14.

General Election – Tuesday, November 3, 2020

All active registered voters will receive a ballot by mail between September 21 and October 1. No Vermonter should have to choose between their health and their constitutional right to vote. As long as COVID-19 still poses a risk to our communities, we should allow Vermont voters the option of voting from the safety of their own homes. If you prefer to vote in person, polling places will still be open.

Please make a voting plan. Whether you vote by mail or in person is up to you, but we encourage you to vote by mail and vote early – by October 24th – to reduce contact at polling places and to ensure clerks and postal workers have ample time to deliver and process your ballot.

We encourage you to **vote early** and **vote at home**, but in-person voting is still available, subject to the polling place safety guidelines we developed with the Vermont Department of Health, following **CDC best practices**.

PROPERTY TAXES

The property tax second installment date this year is **October 15, 2020**. Our final payment due date is **November 12, 2020**. **Payments must be received by November 12, 2020 to be considered on time. Postmarks are not accepted.** Credit and debit cards are accepted at the Clerk/Treasurer’s office for all monetary transactions. The cardholder is responsible to pay any applicable charges for the service. Please contact the Town Clerk’s office with any questions at (802) 483-6500 Ext. 10,11 or 12. The silver drop box on the left side of the office front parking lot is available 24/7. After the November 12 deadline, penalties will be assessed and interest will begin to accrue.

Attention Pittsford Water Customers Water Main Flushing in Pittsford October 5th through October 9th

What is happening?

The Pittsford/Florence water Dept. will be conducting a **nighttime** Water Main Flushing Program throughout the system. Flushing of the mains will be conducted from **October 5, 2020 through October 9, 2020** between the hours of **8pm and 4am.** Water mains will be flushed by releasing water from selected hydrants system-wide.

What are the benefits of flushing water mains?

Water main flushing is an effective method of improving drinking water quality and is an integral component of a water utility's distribution system maintenance program.

Are there any short-term adverse impacts from water main flushing?

Water main flushing can cause **temporary** reductions in water pressure and discolored water from agitated sediment and increased levels of dissolved iron. When Hydrant flushing occurs in your community, you may notice slightly yellow, orange or brown colored water. The temporary discoloration only affects the appearance of water – it does not cause a health or safety risk.

TRANSFER STATION RENEWAL PERMITS

Transfer Station permits for 11/1/20 to 10/31/2021 will be available October 1st at the Town Office, 426 Plains Road. Renewal deadline is 11/1/20. The permit fee is \$20.00 which includes a 10 bag/container (30 gal) punch card. Extra cards available for \$20.00 at the Town Office via cash, check, credit card or debit card or at the Transfer Station by check only. Residents must have new permit stickers by 11/1/20 in order to use the Transfer Station.

New instructions for posting your Transfer Station permit stickers:

Your new Transfer Station Permit sticker should be affixed to the inside of your vehicle’s window, on whichever window (front or back) that is normally closest to the shed and dumpsters when you park at the Transfer Station. This will enable the Attendants to see it and confirm that you are indeed eligible to use the Transfer Station. THANK YOU!

The Pittsford Transfer Station **does not accept tires**. Please take them to the Gleason Road Transfer Station in Rutland.

The HHW Depot at the Gleason Road Transfer Station in Rutland is open Mon-Sat (7am-3pm). (Appointment required 24 hrs. in advance.) Contact Tom Remes at 770-1333 for more information regarding Household Hazardous Waste disposal.

The Rutland County Solid Waste District Household Hazardous Waste Collection will be held at the Pittsford Transfer Station on Saturday, October 24, 2020 from 11 am-1 pm.

UPDATE ON CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

This Fall and Winter will see progress on two long-anticipated construction projects. First, the Town will have a contractor build a salt/sand shed at the Transfer Station for use by the Highway Crew. Second, the Town will have a contractor replace two sewer pump stations located along Depot Hill Road (one just inside the Transfer Station gate and another halfway up Depot Hill Road--between the Transfer Station and Route 7).



ASSESSOR’S REPORT

The Pittsford Assessors’ office has completed the Grand List for 2020 and will be working on changes for the 2021 Grand List, which will be effective 4/1/2021.

As was done by the Listers, we would like to complete inspections for any outstanding, or not yet 100% complete construction in the fall as much as is possible. If your project is complete, please contact us so we can take care of this in better weather during the fall as opposed to spring. There will be no change in your assessment until 2021.

PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE ANYTHING OUTSIDE THE FOOD SHELF - bring all donations inside. Thank you

We currently are buying laundry soap, dish liquid, tooth paste, tooth brushes, etc during the pandemic as well as toilet paper, paper towels etc. We are trying to carry everything a grocery store has so we can meteor clients needs. - This in-person session will be limited to 20 students.



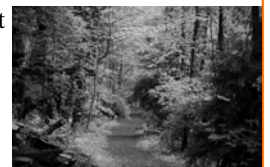

Three trails, Chaffee Falls, Split Rock and Goat Farm Rd, have re-surfaced parking areas thanks to Chad Eugair and his stalwart crew in the Pittsford Highway Department. The dry summer has produced fewer bugs than usual so walking has been especially pleasant.
