Village Farm Pavillion Update

The Pittsford Village Farm is going to have a pavilion for outdoor activities and entertainment. In partnership with Maclure Library, the Village Farm participated in The Better Places grant program, an initiative of the Vermont Department of Housing and Community Development and the Vermont Community Foundation. The statewide program "empowers Vermonters to create vibrant and inclusive public places in the hearts of Vermont communities."

In a laser-focused campaign to raise the necessary funds to qualify for the grant, Pittsford Village Farm was given a 60 day window to secure its match. Members of the greater Pittsford community rallied to the cause and raised more than \$11,000 to qualify for a \$22,000 grant.

Casella Construction is donating employees and equipment to prepare the site and finish the concrete work. Joseph P. Carrara and Sons and Gagnon Lumber are providing a discount on concrete and lumber for the structure. Chuck Charbonneau is donating labor to construct the pavilion.

Construction of the Pavilion will start in late September. There will be a dedication of the building in late October.

REMEMBER.... Open Burning is Prohibited in the following instances:

No person is permitted to open burn: Household Garbage, Tires, Rubber, Plastic, Waste Oil, Asphalt Materials, Materials Containing Asbestos or Pressure Treated Wood.

If you are thinking about starting a legal fire, please get your proper Burn Permit for legal conforming materials such as, a pile of brush or hardwood meant for burning. Those legal materials list can be found under the provisions of Section 5-201, 5-202 and 5-203. Fire Warden Brad Keith can be reached at (802) 779-2950 for a burn permit.

Another safety tip for this time of year besides fire safety is hiking safety, please "wear your orange" when traversing through the woods, especially remote locations known for hunting. You can never be too visible when on or off a trail so always wear bright clothing, safety shoes, jacket and proper head protection from the elements, the climate can change rapidly throughout the various elevations.

Fire Hydrants Save Lives...

Be sure to keep fire hydrants free from snow by reminding snow removal contractors not to block the hydrants when they are plowing. Also, please do not plow snow into the road.

Beginning OCTOBER 1st VSP Dispatch Westminster will no longer take non-emergency calls.

VSP Dispatch will no longer take any information or connect citizens directly to the officers.

All NON-EMERGENCY calls will be sent to Pittsford Police's Office phone/Voice mail.

Voice Mails will be checked daily. Cases will be generated and given to Pittsford Police Department (PPD) Officers. Depending on the day and schedule, citizens may have to wait for two or more days before hearing from PPD officers.

NO CALLS are to be made to Officers' Cell phones. The quickest way to reach PPD Officers is to call the office directly. Call (802) 483-6500 x14 or x 19, if someone is in the office they will answer. If no one answers, leave a message and someone will call you back as soon as possible.

The Pittsford Police Department will continue to serve the citizens of Pittsford to the best of their ability, however, PPD is NOT a 24/7 Agency. These changes have been made by Jennifer Morrison the Commissioner of VT Department of Public Safety.

TRANSFER STATION RENEWAL PERMITS

Transfer Station permits for 11/1/22 to 10/31/2023 are now available at the Town Office, 426 Plains Road. Renewal deadline is 11/1/22. The permit fee is \$20.00 which includes a 10 bag/container (30 gal) punch card. Extra cards available for \$20.00 at the Town Office via cash, check, credit card or debit card or at the **Transfer Station by check only.** **Residents must have new permit stickers by 11/1/22 in order to use the Transfer Station.**

Instructions for posting your Transfer Station permit stickers:

Your new Transfer Station Permit sticker should be affixed to the inside of your vehicle’s window, on whichever window (front or back) that is normally closest to the shed and dumpsters when you park at the Transfer Station. This will enable the Attendants to see it and confirm that you are eligible to use the Transfer Station.

Please remember that the Transfer Station is **open to the public only on Wednesdays from 3pm-6pm and Saturdays from 8am-3pm.** Dumping beyond these hours of operation is prohibited and considered theft of services. Violators will be prosecuted.

The Pittsford Transfer Station **does not accept tires.** Please take them to the Gleason Road Transfer Station in Rutland.

The HHW Depot at the Gleason Road Transfer Station in Rutland is open Monday through Saturday 7am to 3pm. Contact Tom Remes at (802) 770-1333 for more information regarding Household Hazardous Waste disposal.

SAFETY CHECK

With the change of seasons comes the threat for inclement weather and the possibility for long-term power outages.

The Pittsford Department of Emergency Management recognizes that this is a major concern for the elderly or those with specific medical needs, such as medication, refrigeration, oxygen therapy or users of any other medical device that relies on power to operate.

To address this concern, we have created a database of Pittsford/Florence residents who might benefit from a "Safety Check" during these times.

ZONING ADMINISTRATOR NOTES

Fall weather often has property owners buying/building Storage Structures to shelter their belongings. A “*Structure is an assembly of materials for occupancy or Use*”, and *any permanent Structure* (in place for over six months) that is over 150 sq. ft. in area needs a Town permit. This includes shipping containers, fabric & frame tents, sheds on skids, etc. The structure’s placement also has to conform to minimum setbacks from property lines.

ASSESSOR’S CORNER

Assessor’s Office Staffing and Hours

The Assessor’s Office is staffed by Lisa Wright, Contract Assessor and Linda Trask, Secretary as well as Karen Folger, Assessor Clerk. Linda is in the office Mondays and Tuesdays from 9 to 1 and Lisa and Karen are in the office on Thursdays, with Lisa’s office hours being 9:30 to 1:30 and by appointment.

Information Resource

The Assessor’s Office now has GIS available with Property Record Cards (PCR) linked to each parcel. These can be found at either pittsfordvermont.com/departments/assessor or [www.axisgis.com/ PittsfordVT](http://www.axisgis.com/PittsfordVT). The Property Record Card (AKA Assessor’s Card) is a two page synopsis of all information the Assessor has on each property in Town. We suggest that all property owners pick up a copy of the Assessor’s Card at the Town Office to be sure that all information is correct. This is especially important if any changes have been made to your property.

Properties under Construction or Building Permits or Demolitions in Progress

The Assessor’s Office is charged with assessing all properties as of their status as of 4/1 of the year. If you have a building under construction or a new outbuilding or demo of an existing building and if that job is now complete, we would be happy to inspect this fall. Any work we can complete on under constructions properties in the fall makes our work a bit lighter in the spring.
