TOWN MEETING PREPARATIONS

It has been quite a year and the COVID-19 pandemic has forced us all to adapt to a "new normal" regarding how we live our lives, conduct our business and interact with our neighbors. Unfortunately, our tradition of Town Meeting has also been impacted, making it impossible for us to gather together indoors to discuss and vote from the floor on proposed Town budgets, as we normally do. Therefore, the Pittsford Select Board, acting with the authority granted to it by the State legislature, will conduct an Informational Hearing, via Zoom or telephone dial-in, on Monday, February 28 at 6:30 pm, with voting on all warned Articles (budgets and the election of officers) by Australian ballot on the next day—Tuesday, March 1 from 7:00 pm at the Fire Station.

Election ballots will be mailed to all registered voters on the Clerk's checklist in advance of the election. In the Town Meeting WARNING (contained in the Town Report that you will soon receive) you will find information on how to participate in the Informational Hearing, via Zoom and telephone dial-in options. Keep an eye on the Town's website: www.pittsfordvermont.com for any updates as they may occur. Thanks, in advance, for your patience, cooperation and understanding as we attempt to get the important business of the Town done while keeping everyone safe and healthy.

TOWN MEETING ELECTION TUESDAY, MARCH 1, 2022 AT THE PITTSFORD FIRE HOUSE

The Town Meeting Election will take place at the **Pittsford Fire Station on March 1**, **2022 from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.** As approved by Vermont Legislature and the Governor, ballots will be mailed out in advance to all registered voters as a Covid-19 safety measure to protect the voters and election workers.

Please be sure to return voted ballots prior to the polls closing at 7:00 p.m. on March 1, 2022. Ballots may be returned to the Town Office during business hours, deposited in our drop box at any time (located on the left-hand side of the front parking lot exit), returned to the Fire House during the election and entered into the vote tabulator, or dropped off and/or handed to an election official at the Fire House on March 1, 2022. Please be sure to bring your mailed ballot with you for voting if you plan to vote at the Pittsford Fire House on election day. Masks are required inside the Pittsford Fire House during the election. OTTER CREEK WATERSHED INSECT CONTROL DISTRICT

Pittsford is a member of the recently re-named Otter Creek Watershed Insect Control District. Each of the District's member towns are entitled to two representatives and one alternate representative on the Board, which oversees the District's activities and finances. The Town of Pittsford wishes to find a resident willing to serve as its alternate representative. Board meetings usually take place in Brandon (and remotely) monthly, with more possible during the mosquito season and fewer in the off-season.

DOG OWNERSHIP RULES

Many dog-owners aren't familiar with the laws regarding dog ownership in Town. For example, did you know that all dogs must be registered with the Town each year? Did you know that dog owners must provide evidence of rabies vaccinations for each dog, as well? Did you know that dog owners must keep their dogs on their own property or under physical or voice control at all times?

Some of these rules are simply good manners and designed to keep the peace in your neighborhood. Others are matters of public health and safety. All are spelled out in detail in the Town's Animal Ordinance, a copy of which is posted online at www.pittsfordvermont.com.

Fire Hydrants Save Lives...

Be sure to keep fire hydrants free from snow by reminding snow removal contractors not to block the hydrants when they are plowing. Also, please do not plow snow into the road.

ASSESSOR'S OFFICE

VETERANS EXEMPTION: Veterans who are residents of Pittsford with a disability of 50% or more, are entitled to a \$40,000 exemption off the assessed value of their property for tax purposes. This determination is made by the Office of Veteran Affairs and eligible veterans should receive a letter and form from the Office of Veterans Affairs which should be signed and returned. If a veteran is qualified but has not received a letter, we suggest a call to the VA office at 802-828-3379. Application forms are also available at the Town Office or on the State website: state.vt.us.gov.

HOMESTEAD DECLARATION: All homeowners whose legal residence is Pittsford are required to file the Homestead Exemption (HS-122). Tax Forms can be obtained on-line at: state.vt.us.gov/tax or call 802-828-2505. We recommend filing by the deadline of April 15th to avoid late filer fees.

SITE INSPECTIONS: The Assessor will be conducting site visits for properties that have building permits or have made other changes to their property in the past year. If you have made other changes, such as removal or loss of improvements, please contact this office so we can inspect the property. We will be sending letters and/or making calls to schedule these inspections.

PITTSFORD TRANSFER STATION

If you are having difficulty getting to the Town Offices during normal business hours [M-W 8:00 am to 4:30 pm; Th. 8:00 am to 6:00 pm; Fri. 8:00 am to 3:00 pm] to purchase punch cards and you may not remember to bring a check with which to purchase punch cards at the Transfer Station, you have several options, each of which require a bit of forethought on your part:

Call the Town Clerk's Office during normal business hours (802) 483-6500 x 10, 11 or 12 and purchase punch cards over the phone with your credit or debit card. The Clerk's office will then mail the punch card(s) to you. Your bank may charge you a fee associated with this form of payment. Our system charges \$1.50 up to \$50.00 and 2.49% over \$50.00.

Mail a check for the punch card(s)--\$20 for each 10-punch card, to the Town Clerk, Town of Pittsford, P.O. Box 10, Pittsford, VT 05763 and it/they will be mailed to you.

Drop off a check at the Town Office's drop box for the punch card(s) --\$20 for each 10-punch card and it/they will be mailed to you.

Just a friendly reminder: Please properly secure your garbage/recycling when visiting the Town's Transfer Station. Unsecured loads can result in litter blowing off of pick-up trucks and landing along Town roads. Thanks for your cooperation!

ZONING ADMINISTRATOR

"The Right Information; at the Right Time is 9/10ths of Any Battle"...Getting your To-Do list together for Spring Season? Include contacting your Zoning Administrator about permits! Permits are often required for a Change in Use of a property (such as a new or different business activity) or Installing or Constructing "an assembly of materials" over 150 sq. ft. in area.

The #1 reason for Property Owners to get in trouble with VT and Town regulations is that their contractor or sales person will state, "you don't need a permit for that". The #2 reason for a violation is, "My neighbors said my project is O.K. with them". The #3 cause is "The tenant did it without my permission." The reality is that none of these parties have the authority to change or override regulations. The property owner is ultimately responsible for their property's Compliance to the rules.

Then there are some Property Owners that subscribe to the philosophy, "It is better to beg for forgiveness, rather than ask for permission". A Zoning violation can be enforced anytime, for up to 15 years. Why risk fines, legal fees, and impact your property's legal title when the ZA is available to assist with the permit process? Serving residents of Pittsford, Proctor, Florence and Chittenden

With considerable help from our community, we were able to serve lots of homes this holiday season with "holiday baskets," on top of the regular monthly supplies that we provide. These baskets included turkeys and all the things needed for a full holiday meal.



Additionally, with help from RSVP and our crafting friends at St. Alphonsus in Pittsford, we were able to provide gifts for children in the households that we serve.

DOG LICENSES DUE APRIL 1, 2022

Please note that dog licenses are now available at the Pittsford Town Clerk's Office. All dogs more than 6 months old must be registered by **April 1st**. In order to register your dog, you must give the Town Clerk a copy of the most recent rabies vaccination certificate. Your veterinarian always gives you two copies, one for your files and one for our files. If you are unsure whether your dog's rabies certificate is up to date, please call your veterinarian or us at (802) 483-6500 Ext. 10, or 11. The fees to register your dog(s) as follows:

	Fee by April 1st	Additional Fee After April 1 st
Female Spayed	\$9	\$2
Male Neutered	\$9	\$2
Female Not Spayed	\$13	\$4
Male Not Neutered	\$13	\$4

Any person who sells or exchanges or who offers to sell or exchange cats, dogs, or wolf-hybrids, or any combination thereof, from three or more litters of cats, dogs, or wolf-hybrids in any 12-month period will need a Pet Dealer License. The fee is \$25.00. Kennel permits are now obsolete. A person who fails to license a dog or wolf-hybrid in the required manner shall be fined up to \$500.00. Please stop by the Town Clerk's Office BEFORE APRIL 1, 2022 TO REGISTER YOUR DOG(S).
